

My First feast was a Riverhaven event, and one thing in particular really stood out to me, as a newcomer. The food and atmosphere were great. More than what I has expected, although to tell the truth, I didn't really know what to expect. Once the food was eaten. most people settled down for a chat, and a drink, (Something I did in copious amounts, which led to a very good sleep that night, I can tell you). Not long after the

Police to be contacted in regards to weaponry.


Dave: Captain of archers to be determined before Rowany.
