It is nearly here. By the time Christmas and New Year is over and done, Festival will be almost upon us. Now is the time to make sure everything is in order for a wet Rowany Festival !

One very important thing is to make sure the floor of your tend is sealed and secure. The site is reported to have leeches and a lot of surface water when it rains. There is a 50% chance of rain every day.

Ra'chel:

The Little Athletics Field Committee met and we have tentative permission to use the fields for our IKAC and possibly other events. The season we can use it is from March to October with the field also being used heavily in September so we need to avoid that one month.

The LA Committee requires a letter from us outlining the usage we propose, insurance documents (the ones on the Lochac website are incorrect), and our proposal of helping them keep the grounds tidy etc in return (Mowing, litter etc).

Acting Seneschal to find out more on insurance certificate as evidently the one on the Lochac website is not the proper one – it is the second page stating the sub indemnities, not the first page which states the total indemnities. It implies our indemnity is only \$50,000

I want to run a collegia on March 15 &16 2008 - just before Festival, to cover arrow making, fancy fletching, cook skills, bookmaking, shoe making, SCA etiquette and more.

The event could be a potluck style and cost to be around the \$20 mark including hall hire, materials and lunch. Teachers would be half price.

5. General Articles

Talking about Archery - The Sport of Legends.

String Silencers

If you want to quieten down a bow with string silencers use Fur for the string silencers. All you need is a couple of fur strips. If however you want to use modern materials then fleece works well and if you want to be in the middle, wool yarn.

The downside of string silencers is that you are sacrificing some bow speed. But your target probably will not "Jump the String".

Rain

If you ever have to shoot in the rain you will quickly discover that your feather fletched arrows don't work so well as Wet feathers do not work that good. So what to do?

First off try and keep them dry and second spray them with Scotchguard, if it looks like being a wet day. (Some people reckon that hairspray works but I have never had any success with it.)







How to keep them dry? Try a fletch cover or make yourself a St Charles quiver with a closed top or be even more authentic and make an arrow bag with a drawstring top as per the English medieval types.

Fluffy Strings

Fluffy Strings are not a new fashion accessory for your bow. Rather they are bowstrings that are desperately in need of wax. Strings that are suffering from a lack of wax are much slower than waxed string and the velocity varies a bit according to how much it balloons on each shot. So not only do you get a slow arrow but you also get an arrow that will have an inbuilt vertical inaccuracy. Easy to fix - just wax your bowstring. Where to get wax? Allison (lady Ismena) sells pure beeswax in small amounts and it is also handy to wax your threads before doing a bit of sewing.








How to find the Shire of Bacchus Wood **MAPS**
